### Volunteer Screening Process (VSP)

Just like 4-H members, all volunteers need to "enroll" or "re-enroll." K-State requires all Direct (age 18 and older) 4-H volunteers to be registered volunteers. For new volunteers, the screening process includes filling out an application, checking references, completing an online orientation, an interview, and a background check. After application materials are received in the Extension Office, applicants will go through an approval process. Once individuals become registered volunteers, each year thereafter they will need to complete a Volunteer Service Renewal (VSR) form. Every third year, volunteers must go through the full screening process.

For application forms or renewal forms, please contact your club leader, go to our website at flinthills.ksu.edu, or stop by the Extension Office. All new applications and renewal forms must be completed and turned into our office by **December 20th**.

#### Dog Care & Training Project Meetings



#### <u>Citizenship In Action – Topeka</u> February 18-19, 2018

Citizenship in Action is for Kansas youth to learn how the state legislative process works and how their voice and participation in decision-making can make a difference in their communities. Delegates will tour the Capitol, get tips on how to meet and talk with their legislators, and discuss how youth can have a greater impact in their communities.

Sunday will feature time at the Capitol, legislative sessions, and a dinner and dance at the Capitol Plaza Hotel. Monday is reserved for delegates to meet with legislators.

#### Who Should Register?

Any youth 13-18 years old before January 1, 2018. 4-H membership is not required to attend. Registration is dependent upon Local Extension Staff approval.

#### Chaperones

All youth delegates must have a designated, VIP registered, adult chaperone who is at least 21 years of age. Chaperones will only be responsible for the number of youth delegates they are able to transport between the hotel and the Capitol building up to a maximum of 15 delegates. Chaperones must be with their delegates at all times.

### Cost

\$170 includes: lodging, a banquet Sunday evening, formal breakfast, snacks and lunch for delegates and legislators on Monday, insurance, and program fees (i.e. printing, meeting room costs, etc.). There will be no refunds if cancelling after January 15. Cancellations before January 15 will result in a \$25 Cancellation Fee.

\*\*Groups who wish to invite their legislators to the Sunday evening banquet at the hotel are encouraged to do so, but will need to RSVP to their Local Extension Unit and pay \$35 per guest. Youth who wish to have a bed to themselves can make that selection for an additional \$35 during registration. If you have a roommate request, both individuals MUST select the single bed option.

#### Attire

Dress for the event will be business attire. Ladies are recommended to wear a business suit with a jacket and a skirt or pants. Skirts must be at least knee length. Low-cut blouses and bare shoulders are not acceptable. Gentlemen should wear a business suit or slacks with a jacket and tie. Jeans are not appropriate at the Capitol or at dinner. Participants will

be walking all day; comfortable shoes are recommended (no tennis shoes!). The dress code is important and will be enforced.

#### Contacting Your Legislator

There are several opportunities for delegations to schedule visits with legislators on Monday morning or during lunch (all legislators will receive an invitation for lunch on Monday); or you can set up another time with your legislator. When

contacting your legislator, make sure you remember: to be polite, be persistent and be concise.
