The nomination form, a copy of the horse ID (including a color picture of the horse) and fee will be forwarded from our office to the State 4-H office. Three-year old snaffle bit projects must have been nominated the previous year and did not have to be shown to be re-nominated. State fair entries for the 3 year old projects are due August 1 in the State 4-H office. Project Preparations

May 1 continues to be an important deadline in the 4-H year. As the last chance to add or drop projects, members can now finalize their plans to prepare for the County Fair. To help prevent a stockpile of tasks to be done last minute before fair, help yourself by getting organized and making a list.

List each project

- Make sure you have written goals for this project to go in your record book.
- Make plans for the project for the year what materials do you need, tasks to be accomplished, important dates for the project, etc.
- Photo board and bags for photography project are available at the Extension office and can be picked up.

Be sure to have a safe place to keep important documents:

- List of animals with date of birth, tag numbers, registration numbers
- ° Copies of pre-entry forms, nomination forms, etc.

When you receive your fair book, look at each project to be sure you know the rules for exhibiting at the fair.

Put Fair pre-entry deadlines and Fair dates on your calendar. Set reminders if needed so these dates do not sneak up on you.

Blanching Cauliflower



Gardeners that haven't grown cauliflower before are often surprised that the heads of most varieties are a yellowish color and not the white, they expect. The yellowish hue is a reaction to sunlight. In order to have the heads remain white, the developing heads must be covered to protect them from the sun. This commonly done by pulling several of the outer leaves over the head when the head is the size of a silver dollar. Hold the leaves in place with a rubber band, tape, or soft twine. Plants need to be checked every few days to make sure the curds of the expanding head don't begin to show. There are some varieties that are self-blanching but watch them to make sure the leaves actually do cover the head. Self-blanching varieties are "work" in cool weather. more likelu to (Ward Upham)

EID Tags and Weigh-In

Market beef will need to be tagged using the 4-H EID tags and photos submitted by April 1. Weigh-in and tagging is scheduled for May 8, from 9 am - noon for swine, sheep, goat and bucket calf. If you are unable to attend the tagging event, please contact the Extension Office to make arrangements to tag your animals. May 15 is the deadline to tag all market animals. No tag, no show, no sale.

Fair Update

For 2021, showmanship will be judged by the specie judge as a class during the show. Members will need to pre-enter to participate in the showmanship class, round robin will be evaluated by a separate judge.

The Fair Board is hosting a 100th Fair kickoff with a performance by the Schmitz Blitz Band from 7:30-9:30pm, on Saturday, July 24th. Look for updates soon in regards to the 100th Fair!

All members must be enrolled in 4-H Online, exhibit each enrolled project at the Fair, and attend at least one half of regularly scheduled club meetings to complete the 4-H year.

Members who exhibit market steers, market heifers, market hogs, or market lambs, must meet the minimum weight requirements to be eligible to participate in the premium sale, or floor bids for their animals.

Market steers and heifers - 1000 # Market lambs - 100 # Market hogs - 220 #

Plan B Animals

Buyers for the livestock premium sale who plan to use plan B, will need to make arrangements at the locker of their choice. The Fair Board will not have an alternative locker location secured for these animals.

COVID Protocols

While the county is not in a mask mandate currently, K-State Research and Extension is still under a mask mandate. This requires any face to face 4-H event to wear masks. It has been approved for club meetings, 4-H council, and project meetings to occur in a face-to-face setting. 

Fair Book

A great deal of time goes into the creation of the Fair Book.

Please read all of the rules carefully as you prepare for Fair. If you have any questions, please ask so they may be addressed as soon as possible. Leaders will be notified when Fair Books are available for pickup.

Fair Survey

Once again, there will be a Fair survey for 4-H families to complete as an opportunity to give their feedback and suggestions for the Fair. Look for the link that will be posted at the Fair.

Fair Superintendents Meeting

The Fair Superintendents meeting has been moved to a new night. If you are a superintendent, please plan to attend the meeting Monday, July 19th at 6:30 pm in the Fair Building.

Fair Pre-Entry

Pre-entry deadline this year is July 3rd. Pre-entry for all animal exhibits and showmanship entries will be completed using the Fair Entry system. Look for details in the Fair Book. There will still be pre-entry required for clothing, performing arts, and talent showcase with additional documents.

Snack Shack

Once again the shifts will be beginning 30 minutes before the snack shack is scheduled to open. Club assignments will be listed in the Fair Book like usual. It is recommended that the snack shack have 6 people available to work to allow for sales, food prep, table cleaning, and trash and bathroom care. At least one adult from each club is asked to attend a Snack Shack meeting on June 21 at 6pm to go over food safety, snack shack duties, and any concerns regarding snack shack. This will be offered as a hybrid meeting.

Check-In and Check-Out

Entries will not be accepted on Wednesday night following clean-up and set-up. For building exhibits, sign-up for judging times will be completed using sign-up genius again. An email will be sent with these links following the pre-entry deadline.

Saturday, July 24th- The ONLY exhibits allowed to be checked in at this time are foods and plant science (horticulture, floriculture, and field crops) because they are perishable.

The livestock premium sale will be offered as a hybrid model. Photos will be taken following specie shows of any livestock exhibit with a possibility of going through the premium sale. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals will show in the sale ring. All other animals will be sold with only the 4-H member standing in the ring. A slideshow will be utilized for all other animals.

Release of exhibits will be at 8pm this year. If exhibits are taken early the Fair Board reserves the right to withhold ALL premium money from the exhibitor. Premium money includes ribbon premium, livestock sale premium, and foods auction premium. If you see another individual leaving before the 8pm time, do not assume it was approved. Please let a Fair Board member or Extension Agent know!

<u>Sponsors</u>

The Fair Board works year round to gain sponsors of awards and trophies. Each year, Extension Agents and Fair Board are reminded how many thank you notes are not being sent. There will once again be a 'Thank You Note' booth at the fair to help 4-Hers get their thank you notes sent! 4-H Lock-In

Morris County 4-Her's are invited to attend the annual 4-H Lock-In. The event is scheduled for Friday, May 14 at 7pm until 7am on Saturday, May 15 at the Community Building. This county-wide event is a great opportunity for 4-Her fun! There will be a puzzle room experience (similar to locked-in activities), challenges, games, movies, etc. We will follow whatever mask guidelines are in place at the time of the event. Currently, attendees would be asked to wear masks during activities and remove them for eating and sleeping. 
