Japanese Exchange Program

Are you interested in learning more about Japanese culture, making new friends, and broadening your family's communication skills? Then serving as a host family for the Japanese Exchange Program may be for you!

Kansas 4H is resuming the Japanese Exchange Program this year, and they are still looking for host families for boys and girls who are 12-16 years old. Kansas 4H families with children from 10-16 years of age are invited to apply to be a host family for Japanese delegates from July 23rd to August 13th, 2022.

Japanese delegates are matched with a family who has a same gender American "host-sibling", and everyday family life is the focus of the program. As a host family, you will treat the delegate like a family member (rather than a guest or tourist) and can include them in your "normal" family schedule-everything from family vacations and summer camps to participating in chores or going to family ballgames or the fair.

To provide a couple of logistical details, delegates have full medical coverage with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money. While a separate room from the host sibling is not necessarily required, the host family does need to provide the Japanese delegate with a separate bed. There is a required application with references. An in-home interview will also be conducted as well as background checks for all adults living in the household. Fair Season Fun

It is Fair Season and before we know it, it will be time to bring all animals to town. As you are preparing the trailers/cages and getting animals "fair ready" be sure to follow these tips to ensure your family and livestock have a successful fair week

- · Do NOT bring visibly sick animals to the fair
- · Keep all feed bagged and covered to reduce the risk of contamination
- During the fair, keep animals as comfortable as possible to help reduce stress. It is always hot so make sure they have clean water and plenty of air movement.
- Provide adequate bedding and make sure your animals are getting the same feed as they do at home
- Clean the pens/stalls and any equipment (wheelbarrows, pitchforks, feeding buckets)
- · Clean and disinfect all items at the end of the fair before taking them home
- Always properly dispose of unused bedding, hay and feed after the fair and do NOT take them home



<u>Fair Superintendents Meeting</u> If you are a superintendent, please plan to attend the meeting Sunday, **July 24th at 6:30** pm in the Fair Building. (this is a new night)

<u>Fair Pre-Entry</u> deadline this year is July 3rd. Pre-entry for all animal exhibits, carcass contest, and showmanship entries will be entered on the Fair Entry system. There will still be paper documents required for clothing, performing arts, and talent showcase. These documents will be emailed out.

Snack Shack Shifts will begin 30 minutes before the snack shack is scheduled to open. Club assignments are listed in the Fair Book. Please try to have 6 people available to work to allow for sales, food prep, table cleaning, and trash and bathroom care. At least one adult from each club is asked to attend a Snack Shack meeting on **June 14 at 6pm** to go over food safety, snack shack duties, and any concerns regarding snack shack.

Youth Led Church Service Will be held at 9:30 am on Sunday, July 31st at the fairgrounds. Youth interested in participating in the service by leading a song, reading a verse, etc. please email Shandi so she can add you to the list.

<u>Livestock</u> The Morris County Born nomination forms must be submitted to the Extension office by **July 3** (these can be emailed). Swine: There will not be a base bid for hogs again this year. If 4-Hers know that they will have hogs for sale, please let the Extension office know so that when community members call, we will know who to direct them to.

Check-In and Check-Out Entries will not be accepted on Wednesday night. For building exhibits, sign-up for judging times will be completed using sign-up genius again. An email will be sent with these links following the pre-entry deadline. Saturday, **July 30th-** The ONLY exhibits allowed to be checked in at this time are foods and plant science (horticulture, floriculture, and field crops) because they are perishable.

Release of indoor exhibits will be at 8pm this year. ALL animal exhibits will be released following the conclusion of the livestock auction. If exhibits are taken early the Fair Board reserves the right to withhold ALL premium money from the exhibitor. Premium money includes ribbon premium, livestock sale premium, and foods auction premium. If you see another individual leaving before the 8pm time, do not assume it was approved. Please let a Fair Board member or Extension Agent know!

The livestock premium sale will be offered as a hybrid model. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals will show in the sale ring. All other animals will be sold with only the 4-H member standing in the ring. A slideshow of photos will be utilized for all other animals.
