New enrollment and re-enrollments for 4-H members and all volunteers begins **October 1st** and needs to be completed **by November 1st**. The enrollment fee is \$15 (Morris County members, please see the Morris County section on enrollment for more information on enrollment fees.) Your enrollment is not complete until the fee is paid.

Fair Updates

Changes for the 2023-2024 4-H Year:

- Minimum weights for livestock-Market Beef 1000lbs, Market Hogs 220lbs, Market Lambs 100lbs and Market Goats 50lbs
- ♦ Fair Dates-July 18th-July 25th, 2024
- ◆ The Dog Show will take place on the Friday before, July 19th in the evening.
- The Sheep/Goat show will take place on Monday morning, July 22nd and weigh-in will be after the horse show on Sunday.
- ♦ The Swine show will still take place on Tuesday morning, July 23rd and weigh-in will be Monday evening.
- More information on weigh-in times and schedule will come out as usual prior to fair.
- Premium money may be withheld if exhibits are removed before 11am without Fair Board approval.

2024 Animal Deadlines

- Market Beef tagging/ownership deadline will be March 26th
- Market Lamb, Market Hog, Market Goat and Bucket Calf tagging/ownership deadline will be April 27th.
- ♦ Ownership deadline for breeding animals of any species is May 1st.
- Poultry and Rabbit ownership deadline is May 31st.
- Horse Papers are due to the Extension Office by May 31st. This means that the horse/horses that are submitted to the office are the only ones allowed to be used for the County Fair.
- Dog vaccine records are due to the Extension Office by May 31st

Officer training will be held Tuesday, **November 14th at 6:30pm** at the Community Building in Cottonwood Falls. Youth under the age of 10 must have an adult present.
