State Livestock Nomination Information Available

The 2023 information for state livestock nominations has been released. Families will purchase DNA envelopes in advance, submit their animal and exhibitor information online, then mail their completed and signed DNA samples by the deadline. Extension Agents and FFA Advisors will approve nominations online. Exhibitors who nominated animals last year (in 2022) need to use their existing ShoWorks account. Those who need help accessing their account may request a password reset through ShoWorks or contact the Youth Livestock Program for assistance. Returning exhibitors should not create a new account. All market animals and commercial females youth would like to be eligible for the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS must be nominated. Market Beef nominations will be due May 1, with Small Animal due by June 15. The deadline to order DNA envelopes has been moved up to 10 days prior to the deadline, which is April 20 and June 5, respectively. 2023 4-H Horse Project Changes

Changes to the 4-H Horse Project for the 2022-2023 4-H year are outlined below.

<u>Horse Ownership:</u> Each horse should be properly identified with the Extension Office **by June 1** of the current 4-H program year. Horses may be identified by:

- a) Completed Horse ID certificate with all required signatures
- b) Breed registration papers with horse ownership listed in the 4-H member's or a family member's name. "Family member" includes immediate family: parent, stepparent, sibling, stepsibling, grandparent, or legal guardian.

A copy of the 4-H Horse ID certificate or the horse's registration papers must be submitted to the Extension office **by June 1**. 4-H members exhibiting at the State Fair will be required to present a copy of the registration papers or 4-H Horse ID certificate at check-in.

Level Testing: Beginning in 2023, the Kansas 4-H Horse Achievement Levels will no longer be required to participate at the State Fair 4-H Horse Show. Equine Webinar Series-Horse Safety: All 4-H Horse Project Members are encouraged to participate in the live session or watch the recording of the "4-H Equine Webinar: Horse Safety" episode and quiz. The webinar and quiz will be available on the Kansas 4-H equine Webinar page, on Monday April 24th at 7 pm, and must be completed before the state fair entry deadline. Members who wish to exhibit at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show are required to watch the session and complete the quiz prior to entering the State Fair 4-H Horse Show.

Qualifying for State Fair: Exhibit a properly identified horse at a horse show in a class group and be qualified to exhibit in any class included in that group. The horse show is not required to be a "4-H" show. Shows may include: 4-H show, open shows, circuits, local associations (SCSHA, etc), breed/discipline associations (AQHA, APHA, NRHA etc.). Qualification for each group is based on one horse/rider combination. Exception: If a 4-Her qualifies more than one mare/gelding in the same halter class. In this case, another 4-Her can show the second horse in the appropriate halter class at the State Fair.

Group 1 Halter, Showmanship

Group 2 Hunter Under Saddle, Hunt Seat Equitation, Hunter Hack, Saddleseat Pleasure, Saddleseat Equitation

Group 3 Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Trail,

Group 4 Ranch Rail, Ranch Pattern, Ranch Trail, Reining

Group 5 Barrels, Poles, Flags

Exhibitors will be limited to entering only those classes in which they qualified for a particular horse. The qualification period will be from October 1- August 1 of the current 4-H program year. 4-H members will need to have the affidavit signed from the show they qualified at. https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/pubs/P1110.pdf

For the State Fair: Complete online entry information for the Kansas State 4-H Horse Show via ShoWorks by August 1 of the current program year. You will need the signed affidavits. 4-H Horse Project Members are not limited in the total number of horses they may exhibit at the State Fair. Exhibitors may show more than one horse in the following classes: Halter, Trail, Reining, Ranch Horse Pattern, Ranch Horse Trail, Barrel Racing, Flag Race, and Pole Bending. If a 4-H member has multiple horses in a halter class, the horse must be exhibited by another currently enrolled Kansas 4-H member.

2023 4-H Camp at Rock Springs Ranch

Due to Discovery Days being scheduled during the session that was chosen for camp and no members having signed up yet, we are changing our designated date for CAMP. Flint Hills District has changed to targeting **Session #1: June 4-7** for attendance. Agent(s) will plan to attend camp during these dates and encourage any Flint Hills District 4-H members to attend during this session. If these dates won't work for your family, choose another session that works better for you, if you wish. If you have any questions regarding the new process, please let us know.

Sign up for 2023 camp will use the link: https://www.rockspringsranch4hcamp.org/. Early bird registration for 4-H families will open **November 15**, and this website will be the hub for all 4-H camp information. They are offering a tiered pricing model for families to select from. A 10% early bird 4-H discount will be offered and run through **December 31**. At the time of registration, campers will be required to make a 10% deposit, with the rest paid in full by May 1. They have developed multiple options for payment of camp fees this year including a monthly payment option with credit card or E-Check or pay in full by May 1st.Camp options will be available for all 4-H members who will be going into 3rd-12th grade for the school year following the camp season. The menu of sessions will include 8 options to be offered June 4-July 14.

Insect Spectacular

The Kansas 4-H Insect Spectacular, a two-day state-wide entomology workshop, will be held **June 16-17**, 2023 in Manhattan, Kansas. Classes will include basic pinning, basic and advanced identification, insect photography, and much more. A parent or legal guardian must attend with their 4-H'er. Registration, proposed schedule, and full information will be available in the spring. Stay tuned!

Pullorum-Typhoid Testing for 2023

Kansas continues its designation as a Pullorum-Typhoid (P-T) clean state. With that being said the Kansas Department of Agriculture is able to decrease the required surveillance for PT testing. Routine surveillance testing will be performed for each county fair a minimum of once every 5 years. KDA has created a map designating the next time Chase and Morris Counties will need to be tested and that will be in 2025.

If you have birds from in-state, you do not currently need to test for PT or provide proof of being from a certified PT clean flock this year for the Morris or Chase County Fairs

If you get new birds for the County Fair this year and they come from out-of-state, you must show proof that they originated from a certified U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean flock or provide a negative PT test. Other poultry shows may still require a negative PT test to participate, this rule is only for your local county fair. This year, 2023, Lyon County is one of the counties that is designated for P-T testing, so we will share their test date in case you are needing to test. The Kansas State Fair will require a negative PT test still and they are working on details for testing poultry on site.

Please note that if P-T is discovered in the state, requirements could change. If you have questions please reach out to the Extension Offices with any questions.



Time is moving quickly! As we are almost to April, Fair is less than 4 months away! I would encourage members and parents to review the list of projects that are in 4-H Online. Take the time to make sure members are enrolled in the projects that they plan to take for the fair and that projects are dropped that they don't wish to take to the fair. This helps the Extension Offices and Fair Boards as they plan for awards, numbers of participants in events, project enrollment for weigh-ins, etc. If there are no members enrolled in a project, this can be accommodated for when awards are ordered.

As supplies are purchased, animals are bought, etc. be sure to record these details in a safe space to be used for record keeping. If you haven't already, you can begin your Project Report Forms to record goals, income and expenses, participation records to help as the year progresses.


