District Club Days

Our 2023 District Club Days has been scheduled on Saturday, **February 25** and will be hosted by Chase County. The event will be held at the Chase County High School. 600 Main St, Cottonwood Falls. We appreciate the school's willingness to allow us to hold our event in their facility. Just a reminder that even years will be hosted in Morris County and odd years will be hosted in Chase County. An entry form has been included with this newsletter to allow clubs and families to begin planning for the day. We encourage families to take the time to complete your registration form and begin work on your entries. All entries will be due by **Friday February 10 by 5 pm** and will be accepted at either Extension Office or electronically. Just a reminder that members in each county will be placed separate, so a Chase County Top Blue and Morris County Top Blue can be eligible for entry at Regionals. Following the entry deadline, entries will be scheduled and participants will receive an update. NOTE: There have been a few age updates at the Regional level to match with the new state score sheets. These details are reflected on the 2023 Entry Form. Regional Club Days has been scheduled for March 25 and will be held at Madison High School.

A job interview event will be new at the District Club Days this year. A full list of rule can be found on the district website. A brief overview of the event are listed below:

**4-Hers will present a prepared cover letter and resume following the state record keeping guide. You will be able to use the cover letter and resume that you already put together for the area screening (or this will help you get this step of career employment started).

**4-Hers will be interviewed by a potential employer/boss or panel of interviewers

**The interview will focus on a Job Description. The same Job Description will be used at both your local and regional 4-H Club Day competitions

**Interviews will be timed and will last no longer than 20 minutes

**The 4-Her who is selected as the top candidate for the job at each county contest will earn the right to compete in the Job Interview at Regional 4-H Club Day March 25 in Madison, KS. One alternate can be selected to attend if the top candidate wishes not to compete.

Citizenship In Action (CIA)

Would you like to have more influence in laws and rules that affect your life? Then you'll want to go to Kansas 4-H Citizenship in Action! This two day event is sponsored by the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council. The purpose of the event is for Kansas youth to learn how the state legislative process works and how their voice and participation in decision-making can make a difference in their local communities. The legislative visit will not only familiarize youth with the capitol building, but will also show them how they can affect the legislative process. Citizenship in Action (CIA) will be in person for 2023. Plans are being made for programming on **February 19 and 20**. Youth 13-18 years old by January 1 of the current year. It will be \$200.00 for registration. You can sign up by calling either Extension office. The cost is \$10 per attendee and can be paid at the door. This will cover the cost of meals and snacks during the event. If you have any specific food allergies, please let us know when you sign up. Each club is asked to send one adult to attend and help chaperone if they have kids sign up from their club to attend.

4-H Activities & Training

2023 4-H Horse Project Changes

Changes to the 4-H Horse Project for the 2022-2023 4-H year are outlined below.

Horse Ownership: Each horse should be properly identified with the Extension Office by June 1 of the current 4-H program year. Horses may be identified by:

- a) Completed Horse ID certificate with all required signatures
- b) Breed registration papers with horse ownership listed in the 4-H member's or a family member's name. "Family member" includes immediate family: parent, stepparent, sibling, stepsibling, grandparent, or legal guardian.

A copy of the 4-H Horse ID certificate or the horse's registration papers must be submitted to the Extension office by June 1. 4-H members exhibiting at the State Fair will be required to present a copy of the registration papers or 4-H Horse ID certificate at check-in.

Level Testing: Beginning in 2023, the Kansas 4-H Horse Achievement Levels will no longer be required to participate at the State Fair 4-H Horse Show. Equine Webinar Series-Horse Safety: All 4-H Horse Project Members are encouraged to participate in the live session or watch the recording of the "4-H Equine Webinar: Horse Safety" episode and quiz. Members who wish to exhibit at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show are required to watch the session and complete the quiz prior to entering the State Fair 4-H Horse Show .

Qualifying for State Fair: Exhibit a properly identified horse at a horse show in a class group and be qualified to exhibit in any class included in that group. The horse show is not required to be a "4-H" show. Shows may include: 4-H show, open shows, circuits, local associations (SCSHA, etc), breed/discipline associations (AQHA, APHA, NRHA etc.). Qualification for each group is based on one horse/rider combination. Exception: If a 4-Her qualifies more than one mare/gelding in the same halter class. In this case, another 4-Her can show the second horse in the appropriate halter class at the State Fair.

Group 1 Halter, Showmanship

Group 2 Hunter Under Saddle, Hunt Seat Equitation, Hunter Hack, Saddleseat Pleasure, Saddleseat Equitation

Group 3 Western Pleasure, Western Horsemanship, Trail,

Group 4 Ranch Rail, Ranch Pattern, Ranch Trail, Reining

Group 5 Barrels, Poles, Flags

Exhibitors will be limited to entering only those classes in which they qualified for a particular horse.

The qualification period will be from October 1- August 1 of the current 4-H program year.

4-H members will need to have the affidavit signed from the show they qualified at. https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/pubs/P1110.pdf

For the State Fair: Complete online entry information for the Kansas State 4-H Horse Show via ShoWorks by August 1 of the current program year. You will need the signed affidavits. 4-H Horse Project Members are not limited in the total number of horses they may exhibit at the State Fair. Exhibitors may show more than one horse in the following classes: Halter, Trail, Reining, Ranch Horse Pattern, Ranch Horse Trail, Barrel Racing, Flag Race, and Pole Bending. If a 4-H member has multiple horses in a halter class, the horse must be exhibited by another currently enrolled Kansas 4-H member.

Junior Producer Days

The 2023 KSU Junior Producer Days will be hosted in person this year. Kansas Junior Swine Producer Day will be **March 11**, 2023, with Kansas Junior Meat Goat Producer Day being **March 18**. Flyers are attached. The junior swine day will be \$20 if Registered before February 15 or \$25 after February 15 this year. The junior Meat Goat day will be \$20 before February 22, or \$25 after February 22. All participants will need to register. This includes both youth and adults. They have developed multiple options for payment of camp fees this year including a monthly payment option with credit card or E-Check or pay in full by May 1st.Camp options will be available for all 4-H members who will be going into 3rd-12th grade for the school year following the camp season. The menu of sessions will include 8 options to be offered June 4-July 14.

AGENTS TIP OF THE MONTH

Opportunities

At an agent meeting last week, it was reviewed from a brain development perspective why we learn best by doing. When we are actively doing an activity, this helps the brain make connections for the learning that is happening. Please take a look at your projects to see what learning opportunities there are...

Lamb Project

Small animal weigh-in for both Chase County and Morris County is April 29th. With that being said if you are enrolled in the lamb project you should start considering where you will be getting your lamb from and what traits you should pick for. Market lambs should weigh at least 100lbs or more by fair check in, ideally your market lamb should weigh between 120-150bs for a market ready lamb.

Fat covering, finish or condition is extremely important in a market lamb class. The amount of fat can be determined by feeling down the top, using the ends of your fingers. Ideally, you should be able to detect the lamb's backbone by using light pressure with your fingers. If the backbone is extremely definite and sharp, the lamb may not be carrying enough finish. However, if you cannot feel the backbone, the lamb should be considered too fat. Ideally, a lamb should exhibit from .15 to .25 inches of back fat when correctly finished. A firm, hard finish is desirable. Lambs with an abundance of muscling in the hind saddle are ideal.

We will be using EID tags for all livestock animals in 2023. Each tag will cost \$3.25 each and each 4-H'er will be responsible for paying for their tags. Different this year an Extension Agent **MUST** be present for tagging Beef. Beef tagging deadline will be **March 24th**. We have beef tags available, so we can start tagging as soon as you have your project. If you are enrolled in the market beef project or have commercial breeding beef that will be state nominated, you will need to contact the office to schedule a time for tagging.

The small animal and bucket calf weigh-in and tagging will be **April 29th from 8:30 am-10:30am** at the Chase County Fairgrounds. If you are unable to make it to weigh-in, you **MUST** have made arrangements prior to April 29th with the Extension Office to get your animal tagged!


