Foods Rule Change for Fair

Please note that there is a *NEW* 4-H Foods & Nutrition Rule for the 2023 Kansas State Fair. The new rule is as follows:

For food safety purposes, any entries with frostings and fillings must calculate the amount of sugar in the frosting/filling recipe only. Calculation must be attached to entry, or the placing will be lowered one ribbon when judged. Frostings and fillings need to contain more than 65% sugar for safety. Examples on how to calculate this percentage are included in the publication located at <u>https://bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/pubs/MF3544.pdf</u>.

This rule will be adopted for both the Chase and Morris County Fairs. If you have questions, please ask.

The 4-H Horse Safety Webinar and Quiz are now available to you at <u>https://bit.ly/3zbn5XC</u>. Both the Webinar and Quiz are required prior to entering the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show. Once you have watched the webinar, you will receive a link to complete the quiz. A passing score of 75% is required and members can take the quiz until they receive a passing score.

Pullorum-Typhoid Testing for 2023

Kansas continues its designation as a Pullorum-Typhoid (P-T) clean state. With that being said the Kansas Department of Agriculture is able to decrease the required surveillance for PT testing. Routine surveillance testing will be performed for each county fair a minimum of once every 5 years. KDA has created a map designating the next time Chase and Morris Counties will need to be tested and that will be in 2025.

If you have birds from in-state, you do not currently need to test for PT or provide proof of being from a certified PT clean flock this year for the Morris or Chase County Fairs

If you get new birds for the County Fair this year and they come from out-of-state, you must show proof that they originated from a certified U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean flock or provide a negative PT test. Other poultry shows may still require a negative PT test to participate, this rule is only for your local county fair. This year, 2023, Lyon County is one of the counties that is designated for P-T testing, so we will share their test date in case you are needing to test. The Kansas State Fair will require a negative PT test still and they will be offering testing at check-in.

Please note that if P-T is discovered in the state, requirements could change. If you have questions please reach out to the Extension Offices with any questions.

Fair Season Fun

It is Fair Season and before we know it, it will be time to bring all animals to town. As you are preparing the trailers/cages and getting animals "fair ready" be sure to follow these tips to ensure your family and livestock have a successful fair week:

- Do NOT bring visibly sick animals to the fair
- Keep all feed covered and bagged to reduce the risk of contamination

- During the fair, keep animals as comfortable as possible to help reduce stress. It is always hot so make sure they have clean water and plenty of air movement.

- Provide adequate bedding and make sure your animals are getting the same feed as they do at home

- Clean the pens/stalls and any equipment (wheelbarrows, pitchforks, feeding buckets)

- Clean and disinfect all items at the end of the fair before taking them home

- Always properly dispose of unused bedding, hay and feed after the fair and do NOT take them home
