

This year's Kansas Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF) delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one year terms on council. Up to 6 National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview process at KYLF and they serve a two year term on council.

4-H Key Award



The Kansas Key Award is one of the highest honors awarded to 4-H members across Kansas. As a reminder the basic requirements are:

- The 4-Her must have passed their 16th birthday by January 1of the current year
- Completed four or more years of 4-H work
- Enrolled in 4-H Leadership four or more years They also must meet at least 9 of 11 optional requirements. If you are interested in applying for the Key Award, it is important you take a look at those requirements at least 4-5 years prior to applying.
