2024 4—H Camp at Rock Springs Ranch

Registration for 4-H Camp is now OPEN! Families should have a paper mailer from the State 4-H office with an update regarding camp next year. Sign up for 2024 camp will use the link: https://www.rockspringsranch4hcamp.org/ and this website will be the hub for all 4-H camp information. They are offering a tiered pricing model for families to select from. Being offered again this year are two leadership opportunities:

Counselors in Training (CIT) which is for rising 12th graders and the application can be found here: https://forms.gle/ y4Sgjp1sx82h66Nm7. Two sessions are offered-June 9th-14th and June 23rd-28th. They will be given responsibility over a group of younger campers from breakfast to bedtime. These teens will receive camper care training and counselor experience, but they will also have "camp" time with their peers built into each day. The CIT program is a fun and wonderful way to explore what it means to be a beginning leader and a mentor and is a good fit for young people who may want to explore a career in education, early childhood care or other related fields. The program also covers important skills such as learning how to give and receive feedback, set and achieve goals, resolve conflict, plan and lead activities and build confidence. Time in this program also looks good on college applications.

Being a CIT is an opportunity to provide leadership to younger campers while also having their own community and camp experiences, all with the mentorship and supervision of our youth development staff.

This immersive experience empowers youth to find their voice and transition into leaders ready to serve their communities. Teens participate in camp activities and challenges while also learning leadership development and civic engagement skills. 2024-2025 State 4-H Scholarships and the Vanier Family Scholarship

The 2024-25 scholarship process for State 4-H Scholarships and the Vanier Family Scholarship Program has been streamlined. This process has been designed to encourage more 4-Hers to apply for these scholarships by simplifying and combining the process. Evaluation criteria has also been included to provide transparency throughout the entire process. Scholarship applications are due **March 1, 2024 by 11:59 pm.** Please note several of the larger changes listed below:

- 1. Applicants will provide a cover letter and resume as part of their application. The same resume may be used for both scholarship processes. Applicants are encouraged to have a separate cover letter for the State 4-H Scholarships from the Vanier Family Scholarship Program.
- 2. Evaluation materials are provided to increase the transparency of the process.
- 3. References do NOT submit a letter of recommendation; they will be asked to answer several short answer questions about the applicant. These questions can be found on the Kansas 4-H website (https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/awards-and-recognition/scholarships.html). For questions about the scholarship process, please reach out to Sarah Keatley at https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/awards-and-recognition/scholarships.html).

State Livestock Nomination Information

The 2024 information for state livestock nominations has been released. Families will purchase DNA envelopes in advance, submit their animal and exhibitor information online, then mail their completed and signed DNA samples by the deadline. Extension Agents and FFA Advisors will approve nominations online. Exhibitors who nominated animals last year (in 2023) need to use their existing ShoWorks account. Those who need help accessing their account may request a password reset through ShoWorks or contact the Youth Livestock Program for assistance. Returning exhibitors should not create a new account. All market animals and commercial females' youth would like to be eligible for the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS must be nominated. Market Beef nominations will be due May 1, with Small Animal and Commercial females' due by June 15. The deadline to order DNA envelopes has been moved up to 10 days prior to the deadline, which is April 20 and June 5, respectively. Information may be found under the "Nomination Information" tab on the youth livestock website:https://www.asi.k-state.edu/extension/youth-programs/nominated-livestock/. Families are highly encouraged to use the resources available, especially the Rookie Guide.

Changes for the 2023-2024 4-H Year:

- Minimum weights for livestock-Market Beef 1000 lbs, Market Hogs 220 lbs, Market Lambs 100 lbs and Market Goats 50 lbs
- ♦ Fair Dates-July 18th-July 25th, 2024
- The Dog Show will take place on Friday, July 19th in the evening.
- The Sheep/Goat show will take place on Monday morning, July 22nd and weigh-in will be after the horse show on Sunday.
- ♦ The Swine show will still take place on Tuesday morning, July 23rd and weigh-in will be Monday evening.
- More information on weigh-in times and schedule will come out as usual prior to fair.
- Premium money may be withheld if exhibits are removed before 11am without Fair Board approval.

2024 Animal Deadlines

- Market Beef tagging/ownership deadline will be March 26th
- Market Lamb, Market Hog, Market Goat and Bucket Calf tagging/ownership deadline will be April 27th.
- Ownership deadline for breeding animals of any species is May 1st.
- ♦ Poultry and Rabbit ownership deadline is May 31st.
- Horse Papers are due to the Extension Office by May 31st. This means that the horse/horses that are submitted to the office are the only ones allowed to be used for the County Fair.
- Dog vaccine records are due to the Extension Office by May 31st

Livestock Tagging Deadlines

We will be using EID tags for all livestock animals in 2024. Beef tags will cost \$3.50 each and each 4-H'er will be responsible for paying for their tags. This year a representative from the Extension Office MUST be present for tagging Beef. Beef tagging deadline will be March 26th. We have beef tags available, so we can start tagging as soon as you have your project. If you are enrolled in the market beef project or have commercial breeding beef that will be state nominated, you will need to contact the office to schedule a time for tagging. The small animal and bucket calf weigh-in and tagging will be April 27th from 8:30 am-10:30am at the Chase County Fairgrounds. Small Animal tags will be \$3 per tag. Dairy and breeding goats do not need to be tagged. As a reminder all goats and sheep must have a scrapie tag before coming to weigh-in. If you are unable to make it to weigh-in, you MUST have made arrangements prior to April 27th with the Extension Office to get your animal tagged! All payments are due at the time of tagging. We would appreciate exact cash or checks written out to Chase County 4-H Council.

Premium Livestock Sale Rule Change

A new rule has been made from the State 4-H Office stating that "Livestock are now eligible to be sold through a premium auction only sale and youth are allowed to retain ownership and take them on to the Kansas State Fair and the Kansas Junior Livestock Sale." The Chase County Fair board made a motion to adopt this policy as well. Moving forward for the 2024 year, a 4-H member can sell their animal through the premium sale and retain ownership of that animal if they choose to or they still have the option to sell to the floor buyer. Youth can take that same animal on to the State Fair and KJLS. Youth who retain ownership of any beef will not be eligible to participate in the carcass contest. If a youth retains ownership of a market animal, that animal will not be allowed to be brought back to the county fair the next year to show again. The rule that all Grand Champion animals must sell has also been removed. All in all, the sale is no longer deemed a terminal sale. If you have any questions, please reach out to the Extension Office.
