Club Day Tip Sheet

What is included in a good talk? All talks have three parts: an opening or introduction, the body that presents the information, and a short summary that highlights the main points of the talk.

- 1. The introduction is the opening statement. It should catch the audience's attention by doing one of the following: •
 Ask a question. Show an object or a picture. Tell a startling fact Make a challenging statement Tell a short story.
- 2. The body is the main part of the talk. It should be 80 to 90 percent of your talk. First, tell what the main idea of your talk will be. Then explain or illustrate important facts while developing the main idea. Tell of personal experiences whenever they relate to your talk. Use pictures, poster boards, or other visuals if they enhance the talk. Visuals are not required in project talks, but they may add to your talk if they have a purpose.
- 3. Give the summary or conclusion. Repeat just a few of the major points. A quotation, poem, or saying might be used at the close. Audience questions are not solicited after project talks, as they are in demonstrations and illustrated talks.
