Please let us know if you have any questions as you complete the enrollment process. You can call our offices. Just a reminder that there is a \$15 enrollment fee, and some clubs will reimburse this. The Morris County 4-H Foundation takes care of this for youth who turned in a record book in Morris County or for new 4-H members. Families should review years in project as they make project selections and please review all personal information to make sure phone numbers, emails and mailing address are current. Please enroll in any projects that you plan to take this year. The enrollment list is what is given to project leaders so they can communicate about upcoming meetings. The final drop add deadline for project selection is May 1st.



4-H Council Meeting

The next Council Meeting is scheduled for **November 1st at 4:45 pm. This will be held prior to the Achievement Banquet at St. Anthony's Hall in Strong City**. At this meeting we will be electing new officers so please have the 23-24 council reps and the 24-25 council reps attending this meeting.

Key Award

The Kansas Key Award is one of the highest honors awarded to 4-H members across Kansas. As a reminder, the basic requirements are:

- The 4-Her must have passed their 16th birthday by January 1 of the current year
- Completed four or more years of 4-H work
- Enrolled in 4-H Leadership four or more years

They also must meet at least 9 of 11 optional requirements. If you are interested in applying for the Key Award, it is important you take a look at those requirements at least 4-5 years prior to applying.

Due September 23rd

Record Books

You will only need to complete one personal page and one copy of the permanent record. Each member will need to complete records for at least half of the projects that you are enrolled in (if half is not a whole number, round up). If you are enrolled in the Leadership project this must be one of the projects that you complete records for to complete this project for the year.

- Leaders will collect club record books but will not score them at the club level. Please check for completion and that all signature lines are signed.
- Record books and club officer books will be due to the Extension Office by September 23rd.
- Books will be swapped with another County for scoring. Look for a date soon for leaders or volunteers to sign up and evaluate record books from another County.
