Rocking KM prices for the vaccinations and Coggins:

Core Equine Vaccine (EEE, WEE, West Nile, Tetanus, Rabies)- \$65

Equine Flu Vaccine (EIV, EHV-1+4)- \$41.25

AGID Coggins- \$64.25 (Only 4-H Required item)

ELISA Coggins- \$80.50

The only difference between the AGID and ELISA Coggins is that the ELISA test has a much faster turnaround time. Rocking KM Veterinary recommends that every horse receives the core equine vaccine, and horses traveling/exposed to new horses receive the equine flu vaccine as well, which would apply to those wanting to show at the fair.

All horses will require proof of Coggin's within 90 days when checking in at the fair.

Dog Vaccination Clinic!



When: June 7th from 9-11am

All 4-H members in Flint Hills District welcome!

All dogs showing at the county fair must turn in an immunization record with current rabies and the following vaccinations: Hepatitis, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza and Bordetella. Recent de-worming is strongly recommended. Immunization record sheets are available in the extension office or in KRSE bookstore.

- Give youth in-depth training through hands-on educational sessions from content and youth development experts.
- Prepare youth to make informed decisions about their careers and college path.
- Enhance personal growth by giving opportunities to develop responsibility, confidence, independence, accountability, problem-solving, decision-making, and time management skills.



Entries are due August 1, 2025 via <u>Kansas State Fair's ShoWorks entry system</u>. Exhibitors must have completed ALL qualifications prior to August 1, including completing the Horse Safety Webinar and Exam. **ENTRIES RECEIVED AFTER AUGUST 1 WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

ALL PARTICIPANTS IN THE KANSAS STATE 4-H HORSE SHOW MUST COMPLETE THE <u>SAFETY WEBINAR</u> AND PASS THE <u>SAFETY EXAM</u> PRIOR TO ENTERING THE HORSE SHOW. IF THIS QUALIFICATION IS NOT MET, ENTRIES WILL BE DENIED.

Horse ID

The Kansas 4-H Horse ID Certificate (P1039) has been updated for the 2025 4-H program year. Beginning in 2025, registration papers WILL NOT be accepted to identify horses

for the 4-H Horse project.

Horse papers are due to the extension office by Friday, May 30th! **Morris County Test Date:** June 24th, 2025 from 5-7pm at the Morris County Fairgrounds. This is for all participants in the poultry project.

- All birds (excluding waterfowl) coming to the show must be tested!
- There is no cost for this.


Testing is free and is good for 90 days, therefore, it will cover through the state fair.

Exhibition Testing Requirements:

To maintain our pullorum/typhoid-free status, the state must conduct a surveillance testing program. At exhibitions, all chickens, turkeys, and game birds, regardless of age, must be accompanied by a certificate or test chart approved to show compliance with the following requirement:

Pullorum-typhoid – originate from a hatchery or breeding flock that is classified *U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean* under the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP); or be negative to a pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to the opening date of exhibition.
