As a member's 4-H journey progresses, the achievement pin requirements expand to challenge individuals to explore and engage in more opportunities to develop life skills. The pin application forms have been updated at the State level and have been updated on the Flint Hills Extension Office website. Please print the form you are working towards in order to see the updates and changes that have been made. The new version was revised October 2023, so make sure the version you have is correct in order for it to be judged at record book judging. 4-H Enrollment for the New Year

It is almost time to enroll for 4-H again! The new 4-H year begins October 1st! You must enroll via 4-H Online, version 2. You must wait until after October 1st to enroll or it will not count for the 2025-2026 4-H year.

The link is https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in. We ask that you get your completed enrollment done by November 1st. This includes 4-H members and all volunteers. Please let us know if you have any questions as you complete the enrollment process. You can call our offices. Just a reminder that there is a \$15 enrollment fee, and some clubs will reimburse this. The Morris County 4-H Foundation takes care of this for youth who turned in a record book in Morris County or for new 4-H members. Families should review years in project as they make project selections and please review all personal information to make sure phone numbers, emails and mailing address are current. Please enroll in any projects that you plan to take this year. The enrollment list is what is given to project leaders so they can communicate about upcoming meetings. The final drop add deadline for project selection is May 1st.

Any 4-H youth member program age 15-18 may apply for the opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington D.C. area. The event is typically scheduled for April in Arlington, Virginia.

State Fair entry items which include foods/horticulture/floriculture, must be dropped off September 4th from 7:30am-8:00am. **No Later!**

Key Award

The Kansas Key Award is one of the highest honors awarded to 4-H members across Kansas. As a reminder, the basic requirements are:

- The 4-Her must have passed their 16th birthday by January 1 of the current year
- Completed four or more years of 4-H work
- Enrolled in 4-H Leadership for four or more years

They also must meet at least 9 of 11 optional requirements. If you are interested in applying for the Key Award, it is important you take a look at those requirements at least 4-5 years prior to applying.

Due September 24th

Record Books

You will only need to complete one personal page and one copy of the permanent record. Each member will need to complete records for at least half of the projects that you are enrolled in (if half is not a whole number, round up). If you are enrolled in the Leadership project this must be one of the projects that you complete records for to complete this project for the year.

- **Leaders** will collect club record books but will not score them at the club level. Please check for completion and that all signature lines are signed. Leaders will need to set club due date.
- Record books and club officer books will be due to the Extension Office **by September 24th.**
- Books will be swapped with another County for scoring. This year Chase County will judge Morris County record books. Plan to have 3-4 volunteers from each Club assist with judging record books on October 15th from 9am-7pm at the Extension Office.
