Livestock Sweepstakes

Kansas 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes will be held **August 24 - 25** on the K-State campus in Manhattan. This event includes the state 4-H livestock judging contest, meat judging contest, livestock skillathon, and livestock quiz bowl. This will be considered the state contest and national qualifying event for all four contests. All entries must be made through your local Extension Office. Any questions regarding member eligibility need to be inquired through the local extension office before the entry deadline. There are some important changes for 2019, so be sure to check into those. Ticket Orders and Reservations

Kansas State Fair Encampment Building Reservations

4-Hers, adult leaders, and those working with 4-H exhibits at the Kansas State Fair can stay in the Encampment Building on the fairgrounds. Space is not available for children under the age of 7. The cost is \$15 per person per night. Payment and reservations for bed space need to be made to the Extension Office by **August 5**.

Advance Gate Tickets for the Kansas State Fair

4-H families may order youth and adult admission tickets in advance through the Extension Office. Orders and payment need to be turned into the Extension Office by **August 5.**

2019 ticket prices are as follows:

Youth (ages 9-18) - \$3

(Excludes Grand Drive & Horse Exhibitors. Must purchase wristbands at time of entry.)

Adult (ages 13-59) - \$7

Senior (ages 60 and over) - \$4

Record Books

Record books and pin applications are due in the Extension Office by **Tuesday, October 1.** Forms are online at: www.flinthills.ksu.edu.

As you are preparing your record books, please remember the following:

*Junior Division (7 & 8 Year Olds) – When writing stories for your award applications, remember to include two stories. One story should be a general 4-H story that describes your 4-H year. The second story should be a project story that describes your project work throughout the year.

*Intermediate Division (9-13 Year Olds) and Senior Division (14 & Older) – When writing your stories for your KAPs, remember that your story needs to be project specific. You may include information from your 4-H year as it relates to your project.

*Permanent Records – Remember that the permanent record is a <u>continuous</u> document of the activities throughout your 4-H career. In other words, the current year's activities should be added to the previous year's document.

*Application Signatures – Remember to have your award applications and pin applications signed by your club leaders <u>and</u> a parent/guardian.

An order of assembly for record books is posted on our website. If you have questions about completing record books, filling out pin award applications or what pin application you can apply for, please contact the Extension Office.

4-H Key Award

4-Hers who are 16 years old or older may apply for the 4-H Key Award. Requirements for the award include completing at least four years of 4-H work, being enrolled in the leadership project for at least four years, and fulfilling at least nine other requirements on the application. The application can be found on the Flint Hills District website at flinthills.ksu.edu. Once at the website, click on the 4-H Youth Development tab on the left-hand side of the screen and then click on the Morris County Information tab. Applications are due **Tuesday, October 1.**

Don't Forget about Other Items/Forms

Also due on **October 1** are Officer Club Books, Club Seal forms, Pin Applications, project meeting forms, and nomination forms for Alumni of 4-H and Friend of 4-H.

Just a reminder that the Morris County 4-H Foundation added Alumni of 4-H and Friend of 4-H to the *incentive awards* list for the 4-H Clubs.

Agents' Tip of the Month

Now is a great time as you wrap up the fair to start on your record books. Favorite parts of the fair, how you completed your project, what you learned, expenses and income, etc. As you gather these documents or information now, make a pile, place in a file, or create an electronic document to start your record books. October 1st will be upon us before we know it.



As I visited with a parent of a younger child this week, she shared that they had used *talk-to-text* to type a document for the fair. I wanted to share this as a possible idea for helping to type stories for record books with young children. You will still have to go back and edit, capitalize, and add punctuation, but it would help streamline the process of recording ideas onto paper for our young members.

I still encourage our older 4-Her's to type their document. It is great practice for the journey ahead.

According to the *Horticulture 2019 Newsletter No. 27 July 9, 2019*, fall gardens will often produce higher quality, tastier cool-season crops as the vegetables mature during cooler, less stressful temperatures. Plant slightly deeper than you would in the spring so the seed stays cooler and the soil around the seed stays moist longer. Plant more thickly and thin later. The plants may need to be protected from rabbits through the use of fencing. Following is a "calendar" of what to do when.

Mid-July: Plant potatoes if you can find or have saved back seed potatoes. Do not use freshly dug potatoes as they have a built-in dormancy that will prevent growth. Also, grocery store potatoes are often treated so they don't sprout. Cabbage, broccoli, and cauliflower can be started from seed at this time. Choose a protected place where the soil can be kept moist and rabbits will not bother them. This will not be where they will grow the entire season but these crops will be transplanted about mid-August.

Late July: Seed beets, carrots and beans.

Late July to Early August: Seed spinach and long-season maturing lettuce. Leaf lettuce will be seeded later.

Second Week of August: Transplant cabbage, broccoli and cauliflower to their final location.

Mid to Late August: Seed radishes and leaf lettuce.
